Radiation Protection for Pregnant Workers

Did you know you can confidentially declare your pregnancy with the Office of Radiation Safety?

The Office of Radiation Safety will closely monitor radiation workers who have declared their pregnancy for radiation exposure.



Pregnancy Surveillance Program

If you are pregnant and work with radioactive materials or near areas where radioactive materials, and x-ray producing devices are used, declaring your pregnancy is an effective way to monitor radiation exposure to the fetus.

- Your declaration can be made directly to the Office of Radiation Safety who can meet with you and provide your fetal monitor in a discreet manner if requested.
- The program is voluntary and allows you to continue to work with additional monitoring and protection.
- The more restrictive occupational dose limit to a declared pregnant radiation worker is 500 mrem for the duration of the pregnancy or 50 mrem per month.
